Using a drive up grab-n-go system, each client is getting two bags of pre-packed food. Through the cold and some rain we have yet to miss a scheduled pantry day. We will continue this format through July. Thank you to all the dedicated people that make the pantry work.

We are also thankful for the many people and agencies that support the ministry by their donations of food and funds. This outpouring of generosity has enabled the pantry to thrive.

In the coming weeks we will be addressing how the pantry will go forward now that many of the mandates that forced us outside have been lifted. This is not a simple task. We will be looking at space and storage issues as well as the space needed for fellowship of the clients. We are blessed that we have options and all that we do is with the clients in mind.

The Food Pantry is pleased to announce that Andy String has agreed to serve as coordinator of the pantry. While Andy heads our pantry technology team, he will facilitate the communication and direction of the other team leaders.
